Dear Lucas

Thank you for your letter of 20 April about the EU/Morocco Fisheries Partnership Agreement. I am sorry for the long delay in replying.

The Agreement was initialled by the two parties in December 2005 and was adopted by the Agriculture and Fisheries Council on 22 May.

The United Nations (UN) defines Western Sahara as a non-self governing territory. Morocco is the de facto administering power. As such, it is obliged under international law to ensure that economic activities under its administration do not adversely affect the interests of the people of the territory. The Fishing Agreement, under Article 10, envisages the establishment of a Joint Committee to monitor the implementation of the terms of the Agreement, including the impact it has on the local population.

The Government considered its position on this Agreement carefully. It concluded that there is nothing in the Agreement which makes it inconsistent with international law in relation to Western Sahara, and that the Agreement does not constitute recognition of Moroccan sovereignty over Western Sahara. I can assure you that the Government would not have supported the agreement if we had felt it would prejudice the status of the Western Sahara. The Government's position remains that the status of the Western Sahara should be dealt with under the UN process which we fully support to assist the parties to achieve a political solution to the question of the Western Sahara.
